The Parish Council is committed to making its website accessible, in accordance with the Public Sector Bodies (Websites and Mobile Applications) (No. 2) Accessibility Regulations 2018.

Using our website

We want as many people as possible to be able to use our website. For example, that means you should be able to:

- Zoom in up to 300% without the text spilling off the screen
- Navigate most of the website using just a keyboard
- Navigate most of the website using speech recognition software
- Listen to most of the website using a screen reader (including the most recent versions of JAWS, NVDA and VoiceOver)

Compliance status

Non-accessible content

The content listed below is non-accessible for the following reasons:

(a) non-compliance with the accessibility regulations

- Some pdf documents may not be fully accessible to screen reader software
- Some images may not have appropriate alternative text, we are working to rectify this as soon as possible
- Web pages may not follow proper heading structures, label associations or list ordering. We are working to rectify this as soon as possible.
- There may be redundant links and some contrast errors. We are working to rectify this as soon as possible.

(b) disproportionate burden

At present, the council has not identified any content where fixing accessibility issues would be a disproportionate burden.

(c) the content is not within the scope of the accessibility regulations

Archived documents published before 23 September 2018 are exempt from the regulations.
